GIFT MATCHING - A Reminder

The GE Foundation continues to match donations to virtually all not-for-profit (501(c) 3) organizations, except churches and the United Way. (The UW is supported in other ways by GE.) Included are public, private and parochial schools and colleges. To obtain the match for the recipient of your donation you must register the gift either by calling 1-800-305-0669, or by going on-line at gefoundation.com\matching gifts. The gifts must be verified by the recipients. (They are notified by the Foundation by mail.) The matching donations are made by the Foundation every three months, in February, May, August and November. Donations made during 2010 must be registered for matching by April 15, 2011. Only GE employees and retirees and their surviving spouses are eligible to have their donations matched; retirees on Lockheed-Martin pensions are not eligible.

The calm waters of Oneida Lake and blue skies greeted us on September 10 as we cruised through Erie Canal Lock 23 on the Mystere. Our group of 70 filled both levels of the vessel as we enjoyed barbeque and chicken catered by Smokey Bones. GE Elfun/ROAD SCHOLAR (formerly ELDERHOSTEL) PROGRAM

Maintaining the USS Missouri in Pearl Harbor. Our adventure began Friday August 27 with a flight at 6:30 am from Syracuse to Chicago arriving at 3:00 pm Honolulu Hawaii. After a shuttle ride from the airport to the Waikiki Resort Hotel, we checked in to the hotel and registered for the program. During the remainder of Friday we enjoyed a happy hour, dinner, and orientation to the program and tentative work assignments on the Missouri. We went to bed at about 10:00 pm (or was it 4:00 am Saturday).

On Saturday we started our daily schedule which began with breakfast at 6:15am, arriving at the Missouri at 8:00am, working till 3:15pm, and then returning to the hotel followed by dinner at 6:30pm. On our first day we were given a quick orientation of the dock and the Missouri, locating cold bottled water; bathrooms; break or tool room; and then taken to our work area.

During the week, Winnie worked sorting the Missouri's blueprints and other documents; and also helped setting up folding chairs for the 65th Commemoration Ceremony of the signing of the Japanese Surrender. I worked unpacking and assembling display stands about the size of a drafting table; pulling cables for the security system that is being installed; changing fluorescent light bulbs or starters in the bunks used by guest spending a night aboard the Missouri; and taking down chairs on the deck after the commemoration ceremony.

Sunday had no schedule; but was a free day. Winnie and I went to church at St. Augustine by the Sea parish which was celebrating its 155th anniversary. Mass was preceded by a multimedia show of the parish history. The Choir enhanced the Mass singing both in Hawaiian and English. Two multimedia projectors provided both the Hawaiian and the English for the attendees. We spend the rest of the day wandering about Waikiki.

Monday was a workday. In addition an evening class was scheduled about the attack on Pearl Harbor and its affect on Hawaii's diverse culture. Tuesday half of the group went to the Arizona Memorial and would spend that night aboard the Missouri. Instead of dinner at a restaurant we had a dockside barbeque. Before the barbeque we had a thorough tour of the Missouri. Winnie and I chose to return to the hotel. Wednesday the other half of the group (including us) went to the Arizona. We were aboard the launch at 8:15 and returned to work around 10:00. On our way from lunch we stopped briefly at the Utah memorial.

Thursday we left the hotel earlier and attended the 65th Commemoration Ceremony of the signing of the Japanese Surrender on the fantail of the Missouri. This ceremony was scheduled for 8:00 am and was over by 10:00. Speakers

included Senator Daniel K. Inouye and General Eric K. Shinseki. Other highlights included the U.S. Navy Ceremonial Band, the Sounds of Aloha Chorus, taps and rifle salute, and a flyover. After this ceremony, the Elfun Group convened at the Surrender Deck where Joe Gould presented VADM Robert K. U. Kihune (ret), Chairman USS Missouri Memorial Association with a check for \$6,500.00 on behalf of the GE Elfun Organization. We returned to the hotel for a brief meeting then dinner at a local restaurant. Friday we had brunch then departed to the airport for the return trip.

Although much has been done to restore the Missouri including a trip to dry-dock to patch holes and repaint, more work is need especially on the ship's teak deck. Road Scholar has another service program scheduled in February.
