## **GIFT MATCHING**

A New Detail for Food & Shelter Charities - To help food & shelter charities with their cash flow, the GE Foundation is sending out their gift-match checks by the 15th of each month for the first four months of 2011. So the sooner you make and register your donation, the sooner the organization will receive the check from GE.

All donations made in 2010 must be registered by April 15, 2011 to obtain the match. The gift match checks for all other organizations are mailed out quarterly, in May, August, November and February. (To get your donations matched in May, it must be made, registered and confirmed by the donee by March 31.)

Donations of \$25 or more made to virtually all not-forprofit (501(c)3) organizations, as well as to public and private schools and colleges, will be matched. The Foundation does not match gifts made to churches and the United Way. (GE supports the UW in other ways.) GE employees, retirees and surviving spouses are eligible to have their donations matched. When we printed the November newsletter we experimented with printing it in color - and some of you received the "experimental" color copies. However the printing method still involved printing a master copy at my house, taking that to the GE office and running it through a scanner to get an image file that could be printed and we were not happy with the results. We subsequently learned how to create a file that could be directly sent to the printer - we're using that technique this time and you should notice a significant improvement in quality.

At the same time we're investigating converting the newsletter to a PDF file and sending that out by e-mail. That has the benefit to you of getting the newsletter to you several weeks earlier and having it with higher resolution color photos. The other plus is that it reduces the workload on the "Folding & Stuffing" Team that assembles the newsletter and prepares it for mailing.

However, of the ~700 members of the chapter, we only have e-mail addresses for about 250 in our database. About a month ago we sent these 250 a PDF copy of the November newsletter and asked whether they would like to receive the newsletter by e-mail in the future. Of the ~140 responses, all but one were "yes." So this month, those 140 will receive both a PDF by e-mail AND a hard copy. For the May and later newsletters they will receive ONLY the electronic copy.

And even for those who elect to receive the newsletter by e-mail, you can revert to a hard copy at any time.
