We have received word of the deaths of the following Elfuns:



2018 Medical Enrollment

Disclaimer: The following uses initial 2018 data and comparisons for two hypothetical individuals in the 13088 ZIP Code. Your costs and comparisons will be different.

The December 7th deadline for making any changes to your 2018 medical coverage is rapidly approaching. Most of us have already begun receiving those thick envelopes in the mail that provide information on what our existing medical coverage will cost us next year. And in addition, some of us have (or will) receive solicitations for other programs that are available. Let's take a look at how OneExchange can help us make the right decision.

For those of us that have Silverscript prescription drug coverage, the envelope describing Silver-Script's Part D Prescription Drug Coverage has already arrived and at first glance it looked good – the 2017 monthly payment of \$30.80 would <u>drop</u> to \$29.80 in 2018.

Upon further study it looks a bit different. While the monthly payment went down there will be a change in the SilverScript pharmacy network. In 2017 all pharmacies in the network had the same "standard" co-pays. For 2018 SilverScript pharmacies fall into either "preferred" or "standard" categories – and there can be a big difference in copays between the two as shown below:

The SilverScript mailing contains a full list of the pharmacies but as a few examples, the following pharmacies offer <u>Preferred</u> pricing: CVS, Kinney, Price Chopper, Wegmans. While the following offer <u>Standard</u> pricing: RiteAid, Walgreens, TOPS, Walmart

So, if you pick the SilverScript Part D plan, you may need to use a different pharmacy to obtain the lowest co-pays.

And in addition, you can't pick the best (read that as "Overall Lowest Cost") plan without looking at the total of the monthly payments <u>and</u> the co-pays for the specific drugs that you will be purchasing. The good news is that if you use OneExchange they have a good cost comparison tool.

To start you need to make sure that your personal profile on **medicare.oneexchange.com/ge** contains the correct information on the prescription drugs used by each individual covered under your plan. Once this is done OneExchange can show you which plan will provide the lowest total cost for you. As an example, the following tables show what OneExchange produced for two hypothetical individuals, 1 - used a few generic drugs, and 2 - used some non-generic drugs and fell into the "donut hole". Since 2018 drug pricing was not yet available, these are 2017 drug costs:

The message is – don't assume that the Part D provider you used in 2017 will be the one you should use for 2018, and don't do a Part D cost comparison based on monthly cost. But do consider using the OneExchange comparison tools to help you make your decisions.

Lockheed Martin Retirees

There's an additional wrinkle for those retirees who had at least 25 years of GE service by the time GE Aerospace was sold to Martin Marietta in 1993, and who subsequently retired from Lockheed Martin.

The good news is that you (and if married your spouse) will be receiving medical reimbursement payments from Lockheed Martin in addition to those from General Electric.

But you have to let OneExchange know which company's funds to use first. You do this by submitting the Recurring Premium Reimbursement Form, and by now you should already have done this for several years. Just remember to submit this form again as soon as you know what your monthly recurring charges will be in 2018. By default, One Exchange will start making 2018 reimbursements from Lockheed Martin Funds, and if you have some nonreimbursed expenses left over from 2017 you may get a nice payment covering them early in 2018.

And then once the Lockheed Martin funds are used up you have to resubmit the form to "turn on" reimbursement from the GE funds.

Salmon River Fish Hatchery and Lunch at The Tailwater Lodge

We love our field trips, and this one was excellent. Our group of 36 participated in a guided tour of the fish hatchery.

Fran, our guide, described the near extinction of the native salmon due to deforestation, predatory fish such as the sea lamprey, and other factors.



The hatchery, one of the largest in the country, was built in 1980 to address this issue. We watched the spawning process, in which the fish are delivered by a dumbwaiter, sorted according to species and sex, and then eggs are harvested from the females. It was fast paced and fascinating. We then watched the fish swim up the fish ladder to return to their "home" from which they spawned. The results of the hatchery's efforts are a successful restoration of the species and the enhancement of a multi-million dollar recreational fishing industry in the Salmon River (Continued on page 5)

Linkedin is a third option. Linkedin also calls itself a social networking service but adds "business – and employment-oriented" to this description. It has at least two GE-related groups: General Electric Alumni which claims 41,356 members, and GE Retirees which claims 2,865 members. The latter group seems to have some affiliation with GE as it links to the **www.ge.com/retirees** site and vice versa.
