Our group of 26 was certainly smaller than the 60-70 that we used to have, but Rev recognized us as a long-time group and welcomed us as warmly as ever. Many of us had previously seen Jersey Boys, some multiple times, but we still enjoyed re-visiting the story of the quartet from their origin in New Jersey in 1960 through their induction into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 1990. We sang along with consecutive #1 hits from the 60's such as "Sherry", "Big Girls Don't Cry" and "Walk Like a Man" all the way through the #1 "December 1963" in 1975. A sign of the enduring appeal of the music is that Frankie

Valli continues to tour and play to enthusiastic

audiences, and received a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame on his 90th birthday earlier in 2024.

GE Sells Electric Insurance

RiverStone International reports it has closed on its acquisition of Electric Insurance Co. Electric Insurance is a Beverly, Massachusetts-domiciled insurer licensed in all 50 states and the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and Canada. Its owner, General Electric (GE), decided to sell the company and exit the insurance business as part of its major restructuring begun in 2021 under which GE has transformed itself into three public companies focused on aviation, energy and healthcare.

RiverStone International, which specializes in acquiring and reinsuring legacy and discontinued businesses, will manage Electric's legacy liability portfolios but will withdraw from personal lines in all states.

Electric Insurance wrote the commercial insurance including workers' compensation, auto and general and product liability exclusively for GE and personal lines insurance including auto, home, yacht and personal excess liability primarily for GE employees, retirees and their families. As of January 1, 2024, Electric no longer insured GE's commercial business.

How Electric will handle the transition for its personal lines business will vary from state to state. If you have questions, contact Electric Insurance directly.
